Since this year we will celebrate our 80th anniversary, I would like to form a committee to begin planning for this occasion, if you are interested in participating, please let me know.


Lastly, I think we all owe Bruce a big thanks for all he has done for the club this past year.






Peace Poster Contest


2VP Dan created a poster advertising the Lions Peace Poster contest. He/PV will provide right-size paper to those who want to participate. The B&G club will participate.

14 June - Flag Day

On June 14, 1777, the Continental Congress approved the design of a national flag.

Since 1916, when President Woodrow Wilson issued a presidential proclamation establishing a national Flag Day on June 14, Americans have commemorated the adoption of the Stars and Stripes in many ways—displaying the flag in the front of their homes, parades, and other patriotic observances. Prior to 1916, many localities and a few states had been celebrating the day for years. Congressional legislation designating that date as the national Flag Day was signed into law by President Harry Truman in 1949; the legislation also called upon the president to issue a Flag Day proclamation every year.













Dear Camarillo Somis Pleasant Valley Lions,

Thank you very much for the very generous donation of \$1,290 to the OUHSD OMCHS ASB fo assisting at the Underwood Spring Festival. Our tax ID number is 95-6002319. This donation will be used in its entirety to support student activities. We will keep some of it in reserve to ensure that we can reserve venues and vendors for our events. The rest will be used to bring Prom (our only dance) and Grad Nite costs down for students for the next 4 years to make them as accessible as possible.

Our students work very hard to take high school and community college classes simultaneously, graduating with multiple associate degrees before receiving their high school diplomas. We mainly focus on academics and service to build their brains, voices, teamwork and leadership skills. You have seen us consistently over the past several years at Student Speaker Contests, Friends in Sight events, Walks for Causes and how empowering those opportunities can be.

I believe that our students deserve a nice prom with their peers in 11 & 12th grade and a Grad Nite event like other sites, but, as a school of 200, we don't have the revenue sources or economy of scale that other schools do to support these things. The overwhelming majority of our students are socio-economically disadvantaged, so they work hard to fundraise to minimally impact their families' pocketbooks, including staffing three marathons in the county, selling fun grams on campus, and hosting movie nights and a *taquero* at Back to School Night, but it is increasingly difficult to keep up with the rising costs for events. This donation will go far and bring some celebration and access for students who are making a difference in our community, change the economic trajectories of their families, and be productive leaders of the future.




There was a huge gathering at Padre Sierra Church to celebrate the life of Lion Mike Morgan.

Dad lived a big life—enough lives to fill a dozen lifetimes—and still, I think his greatest regret would be not having more time to do even more. More for his family, his friends, and the communities he loved and served.

He came from humble beginnings in Fujian, China, where he spent his early childhood raised by his mother in a small and beautiful village. At age 10, he and his mother immigrated to Sarawak, Malaysia to reunite with his father, a gold and silversmith. There, his family grew, and he became the eldest of seven children.

At 21, with the encouragement and support of Methodist missionaries, he made a bold journey—traveling by cargo boat and bus—to Nashville, Tennessee to study at Vanderbilt University. After Vanderbilt, he went on to the University of TN, Memphis to study dentistry, where he met my mom.

Dad and Mom married after completing their studies and together, their first adventure was to move to rural Maple Creek, Saskatchewan, where Dad was the only practicing dentist for 100 miles. That's where Lisa and Lanway were born. A few years later, the family returned to the U.S. and settled in Camarillo, California, where Dad practiced dentistry for more than 40 years. (I was born somewhere in the midst of all of that too.)

Retirement was his chance to do more—photography, painting, traveling, land development, investing in the stock market, and always volunteering in the many communities he touched.

He was Gung Gung to his seven grandchildren—and to every one of their friends who met him. He is remembered by so many for his boundless joy and encouragement, his warm laugh, ever-ready camera, and the gifts he always carried—most often it was the best oranges or his pockets full of unusual and lovely smelling Michelia Champaca flowers.

The Lupus Foundation has been holding walks in LA, Orange County, San Diego, and San Francisco for quite some time ... but up until last year, it had not taken place in our area. Thanks to the Lions of Camarillo-Somis Pleasant Valley and others, the first Lupus walk was held in Ventura County in 2024. These Lions want to make this an annual event, but they need your help!

It took a lot of convincing and a lot of work to make it happen in 2024. Please consider helping out this year in some way – if even just being a walker – to make it a success!!

It's quite likely that someone you know has Lupus – but you may no realize it! Lupus is a chronic (long-term) disease that can cause inflammation and pain in any part of your body. It's an autoimmune disease, which means that your immune system — the body system that usually fights infections — attacks healthy tissue instead. Anyone can develop Lupus, but women, especially young women (18-44), are most likely to develop the disease – 9 out of 10 people with Lupus are women!

With Lions being involved with such a worthwhile project, we could attract new younger members who have Lupus and/or the families of those with Lupus. People gravitate to organizations and volunteers who help them to feel "seen" – this is an excellent opportunity to reach out to these people and give them our much-needed support.

The fundraising for Lupus Walks is handled internally through the Lupus Foundation of America. For the initial event last year at Seabridge Marina (Oxnard), the PV Lions Club provided funds (about \$3,000) for two things: event T-shirts and paying an eatery at the marina to provide breakfast for all the walkers. Last year, there were some 60 walkers. They want even more this year – but your help is needed!!

This year, the plan already includes a tri-sponsor approach with Camarillo-Somis Pleasant Valley, the Oxnard Noontimers, and the Port Hueneme Lions Clubs.
